

# DAY BY DAY ITINERARY

**Day 01 – DEPART USA** - Tour Members depart USA on our International Flight for Israel. We will be served meals according to flight schedule.

Day 02 – ARRIVE TEL AVIV, JOPPA - Visit Joppa on way to hotel; the port made famous by Jonah's flight from God's directive. Here, Peter saw the sheet of animals lowered from heaven as God commissioned him to carry the gospel to the first Gentile convert, Cornelius. Dinner and overnight in Tel Aviv.

Day 03 – ASHKELON, ASHDOD, ELLA VALLEY, BEERSHEBA, BEDOUIN VILLAGE, EILAT - Breakfast at the hotel. After breakfast, drive through the Philistine country of Ashkelon, Ashdod, Gath, cities famous from the days of Samuel, Goliath, Samson, and David. Visit Ella Valley where David Killed Goliath. On to Beersheba, the city where Abraham departed to take Isaac to be sacrificed, later home to Isaac and Jacob. Next, onto the Bedouin Village where we discover Bedouin life, camel ride and eat a meal in a "Bedouin" style. Drive down to the Ramon Crater and view the wilderness of Zin, the area where the children of Israel wandered for forty years. From there drive down through the Arava Valley to Timna for a visit of the full scale model of the Wildness Tabernacle described in the Book of Exodus. Arrive at the beautiful port city of Eilat for dinner and overnight.

Day 04 – EILAT, RED SEA, MASADA, DEAD SEA - Breakfast at the hotel. The morning at leisure to recover from jet lag. Late morning check out of hotel. Visit port of Eilat, the unique Underwater Observatory, and enjoy a boat ride on the Red Sea along the maritime border of Jordan. Sit back and gaze over the splendid Eilat Bay and ponder the proposed route of the Exodus under Moses, which would have taken the Israelites across these same waters toward their visit with God at Mount Sinai in Arabia. This afternoon we will travel north through the blooming desert to the Dead Sea, the lowest point on earth - more than 1,300 feet below sea level. As we travel along its shores we continue to Masada and ascend by cable car to the remarkable ruins of this fortress built by Herod the Great. Here the Jewish Zealots made their last stand against the Romans as recorded by the historian Josephus. We check into our beautiful Dead Sea Hotel where those who desire may float in the unique waters of the Dead Sea near the sites of Sodom and Gomorrah. Dinner and overnight.



Day 05 – DEAD SEA, EIN GEDI, QUMRAN, JERICHO, BEIT SHEAN, TIBERIAS - After breakfast we travel along the shores of the Dead Sea to Ein Gedi, where David could have killed King Saul, and enjoy the refreshing water falls of this oasis in the desert. Next we visit Qumran and the settlement of the first century sect known as the Essenes, the authors of the Dead Sea Scrolls. After lunch we make our way to the place where Joshua led Israel through the Jordan River on dry land to visit Jericho, the oldest continuously inhabited city of the world – where the wall fell flat, where Elisa's spring still waters the land – home of Zachias and tomb of Achan. Drive north through the Israel side of the Jordan Valley to Gideon's Springs. Then to Beit Shean where the bodies of Saul and Jonathan were desecrated, to visit the excavations of this Decapolis city. On to the southern rim of the Sea of Galilee to our dinner at the hotel in Tiberias.

Day 06 - TIBERIAS, NORTHERN GALILEE - Sunrise on the Sea of Galilee is spectacular. These are the shores where Jesus walked and Peter and Andrew fished (John 4:18). This morning our group will visit Capernaum,


Jesus' ministry headquarters and hometown to most of His disciples. We stop at the Mount of Beatitudes then up into the Golan Heights to the base of Mt. Hermon, site of His transfiguration. There at Banias is Caesarea Philippi of the Bible, a primary source of water for the Jordan valley. Here Peter made his great confession (Mark 8:27), and Jesus made his great promise to build his church. Nearby is the amazing nature preserve and archaeological site of Dan, one of the sources of the Jordan River. We walk through this quiet national park and hear the stories of disobedience that took place here (Judges 18, I Kings 12). Mt. Bental where we have panoramic view of upper Galilee and Syria in the area where the road traveled by Saul of when he met the resurrected Jesus. Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight in Tiberias.

Day 07 - CANA, NAZARETH, MEGIDDO, CARMEL, CAESAREA, JERUSALEM - After a boat ride on the Sea of Galilee, we travel past the Horns of Hattin where Saladin defeated the Crusaders, through Cana where Jesus turned the water into wine at a wedding feast, also the site of Gath-hepher, hometown of Jonah (2 Kings 14:25). Next we visit Jesus' hometown of Nazareth and tour Nazareth Villege a re-creation of the city at the time of Jesus. Then cross the valley to Megiddo, a 6,000-year-old fortress conquered by Joshua, rebuilt by Solomon, and place of the Battle of Armageddon. We drive to Mount Carmel, where Elijah prayed fire from Heaven. From that platform, we enjoy a panoramic view of the hills of Nazareth, Mount Tabor, Mountains of Gilboa, Hill of Moriah (Gen. 12:6), the y-shaped Valley of Jezreel (Armageddon in Revelation 16:16), and the hills of Samaria to the south. All abound in Biblical narrative. According to Scripture the last battle of History will be fought in this area. We bus south along the coast of Mediterranean, "The Great Sea", to Caesarea where the Roman theater and the aqueduct remind us about Cornelius, Phillip the Evangelist and Paul's two-year imprisonment before his journey to Rome. Then up to Jerusalem and supper at our hotel. Day 08 - JERUSALEM - This morning we visit a true I to 50 scale outdoor model of Jerusalem as it looked in Jesus' time 2,000 years ago. Each time a new archaeological discovery is made, this model is updated to be accurate. Next we visit Yad Vashem (Museum of the Holocaust) to be reminded of recent history of the Jewish people and the rebirth of the modern State of Israel. Next to see the Knesset and visit the Shrine of the Book where the famous Dead Sea Scrolls are discussed and displayed. Lunch en route. We drive to Bethlehem to see Rachel's Tomb, Shepherd's Fields (where angels sang) and visit the Church of the Nativity, the site of Jesus' birth. Time to shop before we return to our hotel for dinner and overnight

Day 09 - JERUSALEM - After breakfast we go to Mt. Scopus and motor to the top of the Mt. of Olives to look across the Kidron Valley at the old walled city of Jerusalem. We walk down the "Hosanna Road" along the side of the Mt. of Olives, following the path taken by Jesus during His "Palm Sunday" ride into Jerusalem. We view the city from the courtyard of the church where lesus wept over the city, and then continue our descent to the Church of All Nations at the Garden of Gethsemane where Jesus prayed. We enter the city through the Dung Gate and walk through the excavations at the southern wall of the Temple Mount. Then visit the holiest site in the whole Jewish world - "the Wailing Wall" - at the base of the Western Wall of the Temple Mount. The 35-acre Temple Mount platform is entered through another gate at the top of a short incline. King David purchased this land from Arauna the Jebusite (II Samuel 24:18-25). This history of this area includes: the sacrifice of Isaac, Solomon's temple, Herod's temple, and many visits of Jesus. Leaving the Temple area through the "Needle Eye", we stop at the Sisters of Zion convent to see the Pavement, where Jesus was mocked by the soldiers, the pool of Bethesda, and through the crowded streets of the Old City, we follow the "Way of Sorrows" Via Dolorosa to the Church of the Holy Sepulcher. Return to our hotel for supper and overnight.

Day 10 – JERUSALEM - Breakfast at the hotel. After breakfast we bus to the "House of Caiaphas" the High Priest where Peter heard the rooster and walk on steps dated to Jesus' times; we view King David's Tomb and the Upper Room where Pentecost occurred, then through Zion Gate into the modern Jewish Quarter of old city to the Roman Cardo, and see the instruments already constructed for the new temple worship at the Museum of Temple Treasures. We walk through the old city through the Damascus Gate to see Calvary and the Garden Tomb. Return to hotel for dinner and overnight.

# **DAY BY DAY ITINERARY**



Day II – ALLENBY BRIDGE, MT. NEBO, MACHARUS, PETRA - We begin the day by driving south to the Jordan Valley the Allenby Bridge. Here we make the crossing from Israel to Jordan. After border formalities, we meet our Jordanian guide and bus and drive to Mt. Nebo to stand where Moses stood and viewed the Holy Land (Deut. 34). Here you can take in a breathtaking view across the Jordan Valley and the Dead Sea. We continue to Macherus, one of Herod's palace-fortresses. It was here where John the Baptist was beheaded (Mark 6). In the late afternoon, we drive south down the Desert Highway to Petra, where we spend the night. We arrive at our hotel and enjoy a late dinner together.

Day 12 – PETRA - We arrive this morning at the entrance of Petra and spend the entire day within this red-rose ancient city. We are in the heart of the Seir Mountains, Land of Edomites, mentioned in the Bible in Genesis. These mountains house the Aaron Peak, the highest in Petra and the burial place of Moses' brother, Aaron. A walk through the Siq, the main entrance to Petra, brings us to the first monument "The Treasury" "Al-Khazneh" a dramatic site. This well-preserved monumental tomb appears in the movie "Indiana Jones and the Last Crusade." A walk further down through the outer siq with all of its tombs and burial chamber brings us to one of the largest theaters in Jordan. A 3000-seat theater from the early first century is carved in the sandstone mountains at the bottom of the High Place of Sacrifice Mountain. Apparently some sacrificial rituals had taken place here. From here we walk uphill to the Royal Tombs for a great view of the lower part of Petra with all its Roman remains. There will be the option to walk to the "Monastery" of Petra and/or the High Place. Return to our hotel for dinner.

Day 13 BORDER CROSSING INTO ISRAEL, TEL AVIV, NIGHT FLIGHT HOME

**Day 14 – ARRIVE HOME** - We arrive back in the U.S.A. After going through U.S. Customs, we board our domestic flight back to our homes at the end of a life-transforming trip!

**Tour prices:** All prices in this brochure are based on airfares, land rates and exchange rates in effect at the time of printing and on group rates of 30 passengers or more. Tours may depart with less than the required number of passengers, at the discretion of Group IST, LLC (doing business and referred to therein as "Journeys Unlimited"), but an additional charge may apply. Passengers will be advised about such surcharges 60 days before departure. All prices are subject to change without notice prior to departure due to major currency fluctuations, changes in fuel prices and/or unforeseen economic circumstances.

Reservations, Deposits and Final Payments: Please complete the Participant Agreement, with full names as they appear on passports, and mail it to us with the required per person deposit plus applicable (optional) insurance. Receipt of your deposit shall act as your agreement to these terms and conditions. Balance is due 60 days before departure date. If final payment is received less than 60 days, a late fee will be accessed in the amount of \$50,00.
